

Plans are shaping up for the Dakota Region's 2012 Loess Hill Drive June 8-10, 2012.


In addition to our drive there is an Arts Festival near the Old Market in Omaha that weekend.

You can call Jackie Wampler at the Hilton (402) 341-4400 Extension 5108 to




make a reservation (Mon-Fri 9-5) or call the reservation desk at (402) 341-4400.

environment. The PCA DE Program is designed so that participants can improve their driving abilities and acquire a better understanding of vehicle dynamics and driving safety. Participants will experience first-hand the capabilities of high performance automobiles in a controlled, closed-course environment and acquire skills that will enhance safer vehicle operation in all driving situations.

The Great Plains Region Porsche Club runs DE events from May to September at Mid America Motorplex (MAM) in Pacific Junction, Iowa, and Motorsport Park Hastings (MPH) in Hastings, Nebraska.

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


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Tuning the Boxster by Steve Wilwerding



Promotive's garage may be in the middle of nowhere, but provides excellent tuning services for your Porsche.

For those who have followed my past columns, you'll know that, a couple years ago, I decided to swap out my Boxster's engine for one from a 1999 996. It has been quite a process – after the initial swap, I was not happy with the exhaust sound, so last year I installed a Fabspeed. I also noticed last year that the car just didn't have quite as much power and torque as it should.

I started doing some inquiring last summer as to a good Porsche tuning shop, and over and over I was told to get in touch with Todd at a shop called Protomotive. After some back and forth emails, I was finally able to get in touch with Todd around the holidays, and we decided that I would bring the car down in the spring.

Since I had a week of vacation coming, I decided to

take the car down the last week of March. Now, when I say that Protomotive is in the middle of nowhere. that's an understatement. The nearest town to the them is Harrison, Arkansas (a town about the size of Fremont, 35 miles south of Missouri). Protomotive is not in town they are 25 miles southwest of town, and five miles down (and I mean down) a dirt road from the highway. I told Todd that he should get the award for least accessible Porsche shop in the country, as I cannot imagine a place that is farther from civilization.

In any case, I drove the Boxster down on Sunday night, and on Monday morning, Todd picked up the car and began work. Around noon on Monday, Todd called and said that his preliminary runs on the

dyno showed that the stock program in the Boxster was WAY off – the air/fuel mixture was very lean at full throttle, and it was way down on power. He said that he would track the issues down Monday afternoon, and on Tuesday morning would install the new computer program and I would be all set to go.

Which, let me tell you, I was. While Harrison is situated in the beautiful Ozarks, there is precious little to do. On Monday, I drove up to Branson to do some looking around, and was astonished by how much damage was caused by the tornado a month earlier. If you are familiar with Branson, you'll know that the highway divides the main strip. To the west of the highway, nearly every other business was either



 Γ erdinand Alexander Porsche passed away on April 5 at the age of 76. Nicknamed "Butzi", son of Ferry Porsche, Ferdinand grandson of Porsche. German was a designer whose best known product was the first Porsche 911. While his grandfather and father were engineers, he was more involved into working out the appearance of a product. He never thought of himself as an artist or designer, but more as a technically

To the east of the highway, Branson's big convention center/hotel had nearly every window blown out of it. It was terrible damage, and it looks like they are going to take awhile to get everything fixed back up.

On Tuesday morning, anxious to get going back to Omaha, I called Todd to see about the progress. He said that he was having issues with the mass airflow sensor, and that he was still trying to sort it out. He was hopeful that he could be done by the end of the day, but wasn't sure (I was having visions of having to stay in Harrison another night, and I was already going out of my

mind with boredom). Finally, about 3:00, he called and said that the car would be ready by 5:00.

I drove down to the shop to pick up the Boxster, and Todd explained that, using seven dyno pulls and his custom software, he was able to boost the power of the Boxster by 50 HP and 30 lb/ft of torque. The car is now putting out over 300 HP at the crank, and it goes like stink. What's better, it runs beautifully.

On the way back home, I was able to do some runs on the back-country roads, and it was a blast. The car performed flawlessly all the way back to Omaha, and it actually got better gas mileage than on the

way down.

After the work, I concur with all of the online and email recommendations that I got about Todd - he really is a Porsche tuning genius, and knew everything there is to know about getting the most out of a Porsche – interestingly, his specialty is air-cooled and Turbo P-cars, but he did a great job on the Boxster. Not only does Todd program computers, but he builds all manner of performance parts, so if you're looking to make an upgrade to your Porsche (and don't mind driving to the middle of nowhere), I would say that, in this part of the country, there is no better place to take it than Protomotive.
