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#### Zero to 60

Frozen February? As I'm writing this, Monday was 61 degrees, Tuesday 43 and Wednesday it is snowing, and school is cancelled. The weather changes like a 911 going from 0 - 60. The weather makes it hard to get the Porsche out and take it for a drive without worrying about dirt, grime, salt, and rocks.

That is unless you are one of the many Macan and Cayenne owners. In many ways, they were made for Porsche people who can't stand to park their P-cars for three months. In the "Zero to 60" category, I'd say these two models have gotten off to a fast start.

The Porsche Cayenne was introduced in 2003, just 20 years ago. While many in the Porsche owner family were up in arms about an SUV from Porsche, it has done extremely well for the company. In the first nine months of 2022, they sold 14,583 units or 29.7% of all Porsches sold. Not bad for a relatively new car.

Then along comes a smaller, faster little brother, the Macan. Introduced in late 2014 as a 2015 model, the Macan sales ran even faster. In the first nine months of 2022, the Macan sold 15,953 cars or 32.5% of all Porsche sales. Yikes! Pretty impressive for a model that is only eight years into its lifespan.

So, if you look at the numbers, 62.2% of Porsche's sales are now SUVs. Wow, who would have dreamt it?

What does it mean? Maybe the rate of change in the world is increasing. Ha! That wasn't exactly a rocket scientist statement. Change is ramping up. Pretty soon the iPhone 400 will be out, and the Samsung 395 will be on the market. Okay, just kidding, but not much.

It could also mean soccer Moms need to get to the games faster. Just watch out for tickets! Another factor could be the "ease of entry," the functionality and multi-purpose capabilities provided by the SUV style. The Porsche brand is continuing to evolve and increase their following by providing great cars and people appreciate the brand. Nothing conclusive but fascinating to watch.

If you are one of the owners of the two SUV models and they are your first Porsche, welcome! If you're a lifelong 911 owner, congrats!

What's next? Electric P-cars. The Taycan started production in 2019 and sold 5,774 units in the first nine months of 2022 for 31.1% of "car" sales or 11.7% of total Porsche sales. Wow. More E-Porsches are just around the corner. Who knows how fast that change will occur?

#### Minutes of the GPR Board meeting

#### February 13th, 2023

The Great Plains Region PCA Board met at 6:00 pm at the office of Paul Schudel. Present were Mike Anderson, Carol Lynch, Terry Lessmann, Paul Schudel, Jeremey Kroh, Rick Mourey, David Patterson, and Eric Elliott and Kurt Halvorson via teleconference. Bob Kirchner was unable to attend.

PRESIDENT: Anderson reported the annual Zone 10 regional presidents meeting February 25 and 26 will be attended by Paul Schudel and Jeremey Kroh, as he will be out of town. The Schonesland region (Des Moines) will join the GPR for a joint breakfast June 10th at Bentley Omaha. We will apply for a PCA rebate for hosting a joint event. Anderson requested board members utilize PCA Glovebox for document archiving as appropriate. Least of My Brethren has volunteer opportunities on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Saturdays of the month helping serve breakfast for up to 200. They also have an immediate need for bikes for those whom they serve.

PAST PRESIDENT: Patterson reported he has filed all required change reports for the new board with PCA.

SECRETARY: The January 2023 minutes were approved as distributed.

TREASURER: The club's cash balance on January 31, 2023, was \$74,438. Revenue for the month was \$12,918; expenses were \$10,400, for a fiscal year to date net income of \$2,518. The cost of the club paid Annual Dinner in January was \$8,203.

**SOCIAL:** 112 members and guests attended the Annual Dinner, with the raffle producing \$1,520 for the club's charity. The women's charcuterie event is February 25<sup>th</sup> at the Gallery and Loft/Delicious Catering in Valley. March 11th is Porsches at Paradise, and Supercar Saturday (not a GPR event). A UP Museum event is scheduled for March 25th with an optional self-pay dinner to follow. April 8th is Porsche Omaha breakfast with a DE 101 presentation. A Fun Run for April 15<sup>th</sup> is planned. May 20th features a dinner at Lochland Country Club in Hastings as part of the Club Race and DE weekend, with only a \$10 member co-pay. June 4th is the Annual Picnic, and an overnight trip to Valentine, NE is planned Kurt Halvorson, Secretary for July 15 and 16. Discussion ensued around a movie night and a tech session for fall activities.

**MEMBERSHIP:** We have 165 paid GPR members out of 315 PCA Primary members assigned to our region. An expired dues reminder was sent to an additional 64 members as of February 7<sup>th</sup>.

**REGISTRAR:** The DE 202 presentation in January was well received by participants. 2023 DE dates have been added to ClubRegistration.Net, and will open 4 weeks prior to an event for registration. Reminder emails may be sent to past participants once registration opens. The May 20th dinner at Lochland will be part of the Club Race and DE registrations. The purchase of a projector screen was approved for use at DE novice training.

**SAFETY:** No new updates from National. Awaiting RPM contract for DEs, though dates are confirmed. Promotion of our Club Race DE is taking place with MPH and various car clubs around the region to increase participation. Mourey is looking to add 1-2 new DE instructors to our instructor pool, with John Krecek approved to conduct the training on behalf of PCA. MPH Club Race steward and scrutineer assigned by PCA, awaiting a timer to be assigned. Volunteers being solicited for assistant and backup roles. Working on additional marketing to attract Club Racers and DE participants for the Club Race weekend as well. Will cross market our Club Race with others for the new Mid-America Series this year. Finalized paper registration with Registrar Lessmann and PCA.

EDITOR: February Der Skooner was published and distributed to advertisers and members. Working on additional content ideas for March publication and beyond.

WEBMASTER: GPR website is up to date with all current events; events also added to PCA national calendar. Der Skooner was emailed out February 2<sup>nd</sup>. Club Race page updated with current information. Email reminders to be sent for upcoming events.

**OTHER BUSINESS:** Discussion ensued around acknowledging the passing of members, Club Race deficits, and member sponsorships.

The next board meeting will be Tuesday March 14 at 6:00pm at 10250 Regency Circle, Suite 525.

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

In January 2023, my wife and I attended the Mecum Auction in Orlando. It was a little bit 3-Ring Circus and state fair without the cotton candy or fried Twinkies. It was massive as they processed over 4,100 cars in 11 days. If you haven't been, it is worth the trip to see the creativity and money that people will pour into cars.





The average age of the attendees was well into their 60's all drooling over the cars they wanted when they were in high school. The 1960's Chevys, Camaros and Chevelles were on parade. And if you have ever wanted a Corvette, this was the place to be. They ranged in price from \$20k to almost a million. I don't know enough about them to tell you why, but I know it's all about rarity.

There were a fair number of Porsches on the docket. I got to see a 1959 718 RSK Center seat that was bid to \$3.2M and did NOT sell. The Bid Goes On. In fact, roughly 33% of the Porsches did not sell and a fair number sold below estimate. The 1980's Turbos were hot, and the 930 Slantnose Turbos were in demand. I also can tell you that an in-person inspection is probably worth the price of the airfare. There were a few cars that looked outstanding on the computer or in the catalogue, but man, in person, Yikes. Rust spots, worn tops and corroded rims were just a few of the issues. Buyer beware.



Do you remember the station wagon? There was a Pontiac Safari that was the original land yacht. There was a family of five living in "the way back" as our family called it when I was a kid.

#### RM Sotheby's

The Scottsdale edition of RM Sotheby's January auction once again did not disappoint, boasting a total sales figure of \$44,873,140. Representing half of the top ten sales during auction week in Scottsdale, the lots were exclusive, the weather perfect. Among the top ten sales was a white 1987 Porsche 959 Komfort, one of 292, which brought \$1,682,500.



A silver 2005 Carrera GT brought \$1,242,500, less than a red Paint to Sample example at Barrett-Jackson, which was the top Carrera GT of auction week. The engine bay of the silver GT housing the exemplary V-10 is nonetheless artwork unto itself.



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The other lots pictured include a 1994 Turbo S X85 Flatnose (below) in Speed Yellow, a 1993 Turbos S Lightweight in Speed Yellow (below-right), and a 2011 997 Speedster in Pure Blue (right), all rare examples in their own right, and each bringing top dollar for their limited production numbers.

If you make plans to attend next year, this auction consistently strives to impress.

The Barrett-Jackson 2023 Scottsdale Auction was indeed a "happening" with hundreds of cars and trucks that crossed the auction block, together with vendors of all types of goods and services.

#### **Rise of the Machines?**

After attempting a few article ideas, I thought it would be interesting to give a modern twist to article writing and turn to the new Artificial Intelligence engine, ChatGPT.

The challenge was to write a newsletter article using only ChatGPT generated text. As with all things computer based, the input is important to the output. I tried to get the most interesting output using the fewest possible words of input.

With that in mind - I am happy to submit what is likely the first ever club article written by an AI engine. Read on to see what chatGPT has to say about what might happen in the future at the PCA Club Race in Topeka, Kansas in mid-April. Input statement: "300 word story about three friends David, Mark, Shawn who race Porsche Cayman cars against 40 competitors in a club race in Topeka Kansas. It's a sunny day and they celebrate after the race. Who will win? Will anyone crash?"

ChatGPT enters the room.

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
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
