Minutes of the GPR Board meeting

July 11th, 2023

The Great Plains Region PCA Board met at 6:00 pm via teleconference. Present were Mike Anderson, Carol Lynch, Paul Schudel, Terry Lessmann, Jeremey Kroh, Bob Kirchner, and Kurt Halvorson, David Patterson, Eric Elliott, and Rick Mourey were unable to participate.

PRESIDENT: Anderson shared a big "thank you" from Least of My Brethren for the 6 bikes the GPR purchased from Sol's and provided to them with funds raised from parade laps at DEs. Current needs were mentioned, with a forthcoming **WEBMASTER**: GPR website is up to date with email to be sent to the membership. The Schonesland region has indicated further interest in joint events. Anderson will participate in the national regional presidents' webinar with PCA in July.

SECRETARY: The June 2023 minutes were approved as distributed.

TREASURER: The June beginning cash balance Respectfully submitted, was \$74,330; the ending cash balance was \$65,860. Year to date net loss is \$6,569.



Undercover Boss

race fans in the Porsche Employee Camp were surprised by an unlikely neighbor.

For 75 years, from the boardroom to assembly line, Porsche has been a family. And come early summer, when the conditions are right in a certain corner of north-west France, that family likes to go camping.



Since its return to top tier endurance racing, Porsche has supported its factory campaigns at the 24 Hours of Le Mans with a travelling fanbase of employees, all of whom are invited to camp together on the infield at the Circuit de la Sarthe. At the heart of the action, the Porsche Employee Camp has become something of an institution in recent years, a ringside seat at the greatest race in the world with an unrivalled party atmosphere.

With just 400 places made available for the camp this year, a lottery system is used that selects the lucky winners at random. And in 2023, with Porsche Penske Motorsport competing for overall victory with the 963 for the first time, applications were understandably high. The excursion to La Sarthe was organized under the leadership of Johannes Schneider, Project Lead Global Events and Motor Shows, and Richard Schramm, Assistant to the Executive Board Human Resources and Social Affairs. "We held the lottery in April and there was huge demand for tickets,"

Schramm says, "because this was such a unique opportunity to go to the centennial Le Mans in the 75th year of Porsche. More than 1,200 people applied. We only give out 200 tickets with everyone who wins one able to bring a friend or partner."

Le Mans is a nine-hour drive from Stuttgart, and on the Thursday preceding the race, the roads due east of Baden-Württemberg were dotted with a mix of camper vans, motorhomes and a variety of Porsche models – from high-performance Caymans and 911s to several examples of the highly practical, all electric Taycan Sport Turismo. The Employee Camp filled steadily over the next two days, old friends reconnecting and new friendships forming over a shared anticipation of what was about to unfold. And parked up in one corner of the campsite was a black 911 Turbo S, unusual only because of its matching black roof tent.



The 100th staging of Le Mans meant the Employee Camp would play host to a number of special events. Alongside the traditional barbecue and musical entertainment, the site was visited by factory drivers André Lotterer, Dane Cameron and Nick Tandy, one driver from each works car, to take part in a Q&A session and photo opportunity. They were also joined by Brand Ambassador and 919 Hybrid veteran Mark Webber and representatives of the Racing for Charity initiative which would see 750 euros donated to three charities for every lap turned by the 963 during the race.

But for many, the most memorable moment of the weekend would be more impromptu. On race day itself, employees queuing up for their breakfast were greeted by the surprising sight of Oliver Blume waiting in line with them. Eager to be at the centre of the Porsche community on this remarkable weekend in racing history, Porsche's CEO and Chairman of the Executive Board had come up with the unusual idea of sleeping under canvas in amongst his co-workers.

The 55-year-old was joined by his wife, and for two nights they camped in a roof tent on top of his 911 Turbo, revealing to colleagues that it was actually very comfortable.



While the CEO had a packed schedule over the weekend, he nevertheless found time to spend with his fellow campers, watching the race and enjoying the unique atmosphere that the Employee Camp offers.

"I'm lucky that through my work I can get as close to the action as anyone could dream," said Blume, following the weekend. "But this year was incredibly special: camping on a Porsche, in amongst the Porsche community, is something I'll never forget. The fans are at the heart of Le Mans, and this is what keeps drawing us back."



Following what would prove to be a challenging debut for the 963 at Le Mans, the sense of community at Porsche was nevertheless stronger than ever. "On the Monday after the race, I sent out a survey for feedback on the whole experience," continues Schramm, "and lots of people commented on how meaningful it was that our CEO was sleeping in the camp and standing in line to get breakfast. Everyone loved that he was there, in shorts and sandals, totally relaxed and just part of the Porsche crew."

Two magic days driving manufacturers' latest offerings came and went again last month. And your humble scribe is here to report back on a new year and a new slew of vehicles.

This is an annual event, for which major thanks go to the Rocky Mountain Automotive Press Assn, for arranging everything. And the vehicle manufacturer reps, for bringing the cars.

A few top-of-mind observations. First, the annual spoiler alert; no Porsche participation, no Audi participation, no BMW participation. Audi and BMW have participated in the past. But Porsche has never shown, for at least the last 10 years that I've gone. I have no idea why. They're all missing out.

As for the manufacturer reps, riding shotgun, or in the back seat, I must say, this year's crop was extremely knowledgeable, and really good company. Forthcoming on tech, and product planning, and industry observations. It hasn't always been like that. And I didn't notice even one cringe, as we blasted through the twisties.

Which brings up the route. Oh, we've been in the mountains before. But this year was some of the best of the best. Up to the Peak to Peak Highway, back down for lunch in Lyons, up to Estes Park, into Rocky Mountain National Park, over Trail Ridge Road, down and through to Winter Park for the night. The following day were drives around the surrounding roads. Then up and over Berthoud Pass (11,300 ft elevation) and back down. A quick hop on I 70 to Georgetown and up over Guanella Pass. Then back down, a left onto 285 and back to our base in Golden.

We saw elk, we saw moose, we saw deer, we saw pronghorn sheep, we saw tundra, we saw snow, we saw rain, we saw sun, we saw curves, we saw straights.

Oh yeah, the cars. Of course there were EVs, and there were hybrids, and there were SUVs, and there were trucks. I couldn't find the time to

get into everything. But I did spend seat-time in two, yes, two manual transmission fun machines. The Toyota Corolla GR. And the Acura Integra Type S.

Did I enjoy them? Is Trail Ridge Road the highest road in North America that goes somewhere? The GR can't escape its econobox roots. But 300 hp from a 1.6-liter three cylinder mill, driving all four wheels, can get your attention. Hey, Subaru, this really is a street rally car for today. Linear punch into the stomach, a nice, tight ride, nothought steering. If you're interested, I'd order one today. They won't last.

Nor will the Integra. A year ago, I drove the A-Spec, and I found it a buzz-box, sadly lacking in oomph. No longer. The exterior's more pumped up, the interior's more luxe, the power's more ... more. And, on the overrun, the engine gives you a "pop pop pop" song that's almost worth the price of admission, in and of itself.

Trends this year. The Honda Accord hybrid had paddle shifters that didn't actually shift the vehicle at all. What they did was control the degree of regenerative braking, when you lifted. You went from virtually none to, well, a lot. Paddle on the left for more, paddle on the right for less.

Full-on, I found this remarkably useful in the twisties. But I couldn't help wondering, does it affect fuel economy? Honda's rep said hardly. Does it save on wear and tear on brake pads? Yes. Do brake lights come on, when in full regenerative mode? I forgot to ask. But I did hum Fleetwood Mac's "You Can Go Your Own Way."

The Mercedes-Benz AMG GLE 63 S 4matic+SUV won the longest model name contest. And, with a reported 603 hp and 627 ft-lbs of torque, with the help of a 48-volt hybrid assist, leading to a reported 0-60 time of 3.7 seconds, at an MSRP north of \$160K, it also won the most outrageous vehicle award, at least from me.

The Benz also featured the most over-the-top dash. The usual digital instrument cluster, flanked by the largest infotainment system maybe in existence. I mean, in nav mode it looks like you unfolded a complete digital, touch-sensitive Hagstrom map. And then, to its right, there's another digital panel, just for the front-seat passenger. And it all kinda flows up, almost into the straight-ahead sight-line, giving a slightly truncated view forward. A true Godzilla vehicle.

What else? The new Prius Prime looks sensational. And drives like a good car, not a Mobil Economy Run entrant. God bless the natural induction of the Lexus IS 500. And the massaging rear seat in the Genesis G90.


