## **Board of Directors Meeting**

## Minutes of the GPR Board Meeting January 9, 2024

The Great Plains Region PCA Board met by teleconference at 6:00 pm. Present were Mike Anderson, Eric Elliott, Kurt Halvorson, Bob Kirchner, Jeremey Kroh, Terry Lessmann, Carol Lynch, Jim Medici, Paul Schudel, and Roger Williams.

**PRESIDENT:** PCA roster has been update with our new board members. Anderson has reached out to Steven Kemp, our new Zone 10 Representative. Anderson reports Kemp's enthusiasm is contagious. Porsche Omaha desires to plan more events with the club this year given their new facility and accommodations. Our Annual Dinner January 20<sup>th</sup> at Omaha Country Club will include our annual \$5/ ticket raffle to support our charity Least of My Brethren, as well as a request for participants to bring a hat, gloves or socks to benefit them in exchange for a raffle ticket. Schonesland Region will join GPR for another joint breakfast event July 12<sup>th</sup>.

**SECRETARY:** The November 2023 minutes were approved as distributed. There was no official board meeting in December.

**TREASURER:** The October 2023 ending cash balance was \$69,811; the December 2023 ending cash balance was \$67,904. The year-to-date 2023 loss was \$7,835, with revenues of \$20,984 and expenses of \$28,819. Higher interest rates in 2023 allowed us to earn \$952. Porsche Omaha gracious-ly increased their contribution to the club by 5% this year to \$5,250. Thank you, Porsche Omaha!

**SOCIAL:** The December 9<sup>th</sup> monthly breakfast was held back at Paradise Bakery. January 13<sup>th</sup> breakfast will be held at Porsche Omaha at 8:30am. The Annual Dinner will be held at Omaha Country Club on Saturday, January 20<sup>th</sup>, 2024 at 6:00pm. Over 119 members and guests have RSVP'd. Raffle items and awards will be presented. February 7<sup>th</sup> will be a movie night at Village Pointe at 7pm to watch *Ferrari* with the rental of a theater for the club. February 10<sup>th</sup> breakfast will be at Paradise Bakery at 8:00am. A Driving Tour to Eureka Springs and Bentonville, Arkansas with two overnights and a museum tour is being planned for July 19-21.

**MEMBERSHIP:** We ended 2023 with a record 239 GPR members, and now have 174 paid GPR members (renewals and new) out of 325 PCA primary members assigned to our region. Approximately 65 members have yet to renew. Dues will be collected at the Annual Dinner for those who have RSVP'd but have not yet paid their 2024 dues, and email reminders for other renewals will go out following the Annual Dinner. The Porsche Buddy system will continue with assigning board members to new members to help facilitate their participation in events, answer questions, and otherwise act as a liaison to the club member.

**REGISTRAR:** DE dates for 2024 will be added to ClubRegistration.net when the contracts are signed with MPH and RPM. An article discussing DE novice training has been submitted for an upcoming issue of Der Skooner.

**SAFETY:** MPH contract and schedule for the Club Race and DE has been finalized, with only a \$1,000 increase negotiated over 2023. Pricing to Club Racers and DE participants is in process. The PCA Club Race application for the event is underway, volunteers are being solicited, OnSite Tires will provide support, and a block of rooms at a preferred rate for the Holiday Inn Express in Hastings has been secured. Three DE events are planned at RPM for 2024 on 4/20, 8/24 and 10/19. DE contracts to follow.

**EDITOR:** December and January issues of Der Skooner were published and distributed to our advertisers and our website. Two member articles were submitted for the February issue.

**WEBMASTER:** GPR website is up to date with known events, along with requisite RSVP forms. January Der Skooner was emailed to members on January 2<sup>nd</sup>. The board members' page on the GPR website is updated to reflect the 2024 board members, and email aliases have been re-routed to our new board members.

The next board meeting will be Tuesday, February 13<sup>th</sup> at 6:00pm at Porsche Omaha.

PCA membership requires ownership or lease of a Porsche, or that you are in a Porsche related business. But, if you are not an owner yet and are actively trying to become one, the PCA Test Drive Program is an excellent option.

The PCA Test Drive program includes a one-year subscription to Porsche Panorama, the club's national monthly magazine, a temporary account to log on to our website, and the monthly Mart Fresh News email newsletter. The magazine provides you with news and feature stories covering all aspects of Porsche as well as technical articles that impart valuable information about the cars we drive. Crucially, the temporary website account gives you online access to hundreds of Porsches for sale by PCA members in The Mart, which is also featured in every issue of Panorama.

PCA Test Drive is not a full membership in PCA and does not entitle you to some member benefits such as:

- Attending member only events
- Entering the Member-Only Raffle
- Voting or becoming a member of a Region

Great Plains Region welcomes Test Drive Members to our events with exceptions:

- Whenever the Great Plains Region pays for the expense of the event, (The Winter Party, Annual Picnic etc.) the PCA Test Drive Member is welcome to attend but will be asked to pay for the expenses incurred by the club to host the event.
- Events sponsored by The Great Pains Region, where the individual GPR/PCA members pay their own expenses, welcome the Test Participants as a paying attendee.

## Don't Miss Out on DE Fun

Your Porsche was designed for high-speed motoring, and if you're not enjoying that aspect of your car, you're really missing out on exploring the soul of your Porsche. But you should never do your high-speed driving on public roads – it's dangerous for you and innocent bystanders and you don't want to spend a night (or more) in the gray bar hotel. That's where High Performance Driver's Education (HPDE or more commonly DE) comes into play.

#### What is DE?

Driver's Education is a track event where drivers are placed into run groups based on the driver's experience. Our club has 3 run groups – novice (little or no experience), intermediate, and advanced. You'll drive in your run group for 20 min on the track, then wait 40 min to return. Safety is the Porsche Club's #1 concern and our rules reflect that priority. All drivers are required to follow the rules in order to keep everyone and their cars safe. Sessions are conducted in an orderly fashion.

#### What DE is NOT

DE is <u>not racing</u>. Cars are not timed, lined up side by side for rolling starts, and no one is considered 'the winner' of a session. Our club does not allow passing in corners, only on straight sections under certain conditions. There is no 'rubbin is racin' at all. Dangerous or aggressive driving will not be tolerated. Once again, safety is our #1 priority. Everyone will have a ton of fun by just following the rules.



#### **Novice training**

As mentioned above, people who've never driven on a track are welcome to participate in our events and are required to attend novice training. There is no extra charge for participating in the novice group. You'll alternate between driving on the track and attending classroom training. The classroom covers a variety of topics, including the anatomy of a corner (track in, apex, track out), proper braking techniques, keeping your car balanced, proper passing etiquette, corner workers and what their flags mean, etc., to highlight just a few items covered. I mentioned passing wasn't allowed in the corners, but when passing on the straight a driver can only pass the car in front of them IF the driver in front gives a 'point by'. This allows both drivers to be aware when the pass will be made, resulting in a safe execution of the maneuver.

An instructor will be assigned to each novice before the event and the instructor will ride with the novice whenever the novice is on the track. The instructor will have a communication device that will give both driver and instructor the ability to talk to each other, allowing the instructor to give instant advice and feedback. Our club is fortunate to have excellent instructors, so you can't go wrong with whoever is assigned to you. The novice will 'graduate' to intermediate when the instructor feels they're ready to safely drive solo. This is usually accomplished after 2 days at the track.

It's important to note that drivers are allowed to run at their own pace. It's perfectly fine to run at a reduced rate if that's the pace a driver feels comfortable running at. Or if you want to probe the limits of your Porsche, we'll work on the basics first and then get you up to a higher speed as the day progresses. The choice is yours. When I first started doing DEs, I probably ran at 75% to protect my car while today I run at 90%. As long as you aren't holding others up, no one cares how fast you choose to drive. It's about having fun and being safe regardless of the speed.

#### Car Prep & Tech

A tech inspection sheet is provided when you register for an event. It covers a multitude of items to check, such as brake lights, no cracks in the windshield, etc. – routine items to be sure your car is safe.

The big three items to be concerned with are tires, brake pads, and recent brake fluid flush. The first two are important so your weekend doesn't end prematurely, while the last one is for everyone's safety. We require your brake fluid to have been flushed within the last 6 mo. prior to the event. Porsche Omaha, Star Class Motors, and SLM will all do complimentary tech inspections and would also be able to meet any mechanical needs your car may have before it hits the track. Plan ahead if you choose to have a complimentary tech inspection as all these businesses tend to have schedules that are full for 2 Where can it take you? weeks.

#### Helmets

Helmets are required for all drivers. There are several local businesses that sell helmets along with many online sites. Prices can range from \$250-1000. Motorcycle helmets are not allowed as they're not safety rated for fire. Our club has a few loaner helmets available in case you just want to dip your toe in the DE waters and see if you like it before diving in and buying your own helmet. Contact our Safety Chair to reserve one. First come, first served.



#### What if I have a 4-door?

Cayennes, Macans, and Panameras are all welcome to participate in DEs. The two exceptions that are NOT allowed at the track are EVs and cars with autonomous braking systems that cannot be turned off. If you have a gas powered 4door and wish to participate, you may want to purchase and install heavy-duty brake pads as the brakes will be under higher stress due to the weight and harder braking than being done on the street. We've hosted Macan and Panamera drivers in the past. It should also be noted that

you don't have to specifically use a Porsche at our events. We regularly get Corvettes, Camaros, and Mustangs at our DEs.



First, by participating in our DEs, you'll become a better driver because you understand the dynamics of driving and how they apply to your Porsche. You'll also get to know a great bunch of club members who are always ready to help or pass along advice. But another cool item with participating in DEs is that it allows you to drive on famous tracks. Can you play a round of golf at Augusta National, or a game of baseball at Fenway Park (that's for you Sandy)? Nope. But you can drive at Laguna Seca, or COTA, or Daytona. The training and knowledge you garner from GPR events applies to all tracks. Don't be afraid to expand your horizons and experience a bucket list event.

#### How to sign up?

Registration for any GPR DE is through Club Registration. If you've participated in any GPR fun runs, you'll already have a CR account and it will work fine for DE registration. Otherwise, it only takes 5 min or less to create an account on clubregistration.net. Our events are all findable by searching for GPR on CR. Our DE schedule is still being firmed up but there will be three single day DEs at Raceway Park of the Midlands (RPM) in Pacific Junction, IA throughout the year and a 2-day event in conjunction with our Club Race at Motorsports Park at Hastings (MPH) in mid-May. Watch Der Skooner for exact dates. It's important to sign up early for novice training as there may be a limited number of instructors available for any particular event. Instructors are volunteers and may not be able to attend every DE, so the list varies for each event. Novices are assigned an instructor based on when they registered, and you don't want to be left out of a DE because you weren't high enough on the list.

#### Cost?

Until we have signed contracts and firm dates with RPM & MPH, we won't have the ability to advertise entry fees in this article. We are very close to finalizing contracts. Rates will be published in our Club Reg entries, but rate estimates should be in the \$200-300 range (RPM will be on the lower end of this estimate since they are 1day events and MPH on the higher end since it's

a multi-day event). For your fee, you'll get 6-8 sessions per day at RPM and 4-6 sessions per day at MPH (remember there are more run groups at the Club Race). Regardless of which event you choose, you'll get plenty of track time for your fee.


#### Still not sure?

You may wish to sign up for our annual DE 101 seminar scheduled for February 10th at Porsche Omaha. We'll go over what to expect and how to prepare for your first DE in the seminar. If you're still not sure, come out to observe one of our events. You're always welcome to watch, the only requirement is to sign our waiver. At noon, the drivers stop for lunch but we do Parade Laps. Anyone can take their car on the track and follow a pace car for 5 laps at highway speeds. We only require a \$10 donation (per car) that goes to our club's charity. Anyone can ride in the car during Parade Laps, including kids. Or you can hitch a ride from someone doing Parade Laps and experience the track from the passenger's seat. Just be warned that Parade Laps are the gateway drug to DE'ing. You'll be convinced to sign up for a DE after doing Parade Laps. And you'll be happy you did.

## GPR Driving Tours (AKA: Fun Runs!)

#### What is a Fun Run?

Three or four times a year, the Great Plains Region holds "Fun Runs" for members. These are pre-planned routes that are either one way, "point to point" routes, or "out and back" routes. On occasion we hold an overnight fun run with a dinner that participants really like.

Fun Runs start at a single location with the location dependent on the route of the fun run. Typical routes are developed to avoid congested areas that will enable the group to stay together, with enjoyable roads (lots of curves and scenery) that one would not typically travel on. Often, the drive ends at a great lunch location or point of interest.

These events are a great way to meet other club members, their cars and of course have an excuse to do nothing but drive your Porsche. (We do allow other vehicles)

Some highlights of what to expect before and during a Fun Run:

- As Fun Runs are planned, registration is required on ClubReg. E-signature waivers (driver and passenger) are all done on ClubReg as well.
- Look for dates on the GPR website and in Der Skooner

Prior to the Fun Run, do basic car checks: tire pressure, oil level, full tank of gas, minor spare parts to bring, etc.

The day of the Fun Run, check for any changes due to weather. When you arrive at the starting point, check in with the Fun Run leader. No waivers will equal No Participation!

- Tour leader will hold a safety briefing: As with all PCA events, your safety is the key objective.
- Group review of the route. Starting and ending point, length, duration, mid-point stop, if needed.
- Driving speed expectations.
- What to do if you get split from the group, breakdown etc..
- Key points to look for along the way
- They will identify the leader and car, mid-point car/driver if needed and the sweeper car/driver.
- Leader, mid-point and sweeper cars will have radios and two occupants to stay in communication with each other.
- Additional radios may be distributed it's always good to hear the banter back and forth....
- Most of all, have fun and check out the look on folks faces as a line of great looking Porsche's drive by.

#### The PCA formal definition of a Driving Tour:

Driving Tour: A driving tour is an organized event in which participants gather at a start point defined on the PCA event insurance certificate. All participants sign liability waivers and depart in a group or groups consisting of both a lead and a sweeper car(s) driving the specified route, ending in a group or groups at the location identified on the insurance certificate. PCA coverage is only in effect for the route defined by the start point and end point on the insurance certificate and driven by the participants who have signed waivers for that driving tour. Participants who intentionally separate themselves from the group are considered to have left the driving tour and may no longer be covered under PCA insurance.

And auto racing ... it has evolved into a business, a very big global entertainment business, soon to have vroom vroom replaced by humm. Meredith would have smiled.

We all have our memories, and films like "Ferrari," which help us remember. Remember how times change, and how they don't.


